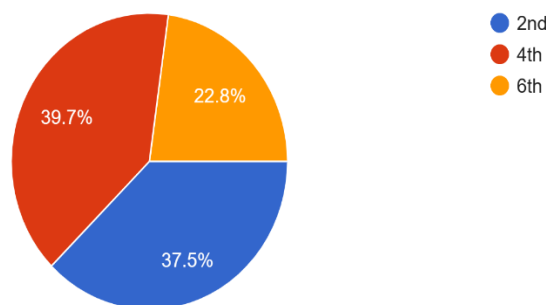
### STUDENTS' FEEDBACK ON THE SYLLABUS AND ITS TRANSACTION 2021-22

---

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- **Response:** In the feedback on the syllabus and its transaction at the institution a total of 706 students registered their feedback. The proportion of responses from the three even semester viz. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semester stood at 37.5 percent, 39.7 percent and 22.8 percent, respectively on the following aspects of the syllabus and its transaction.

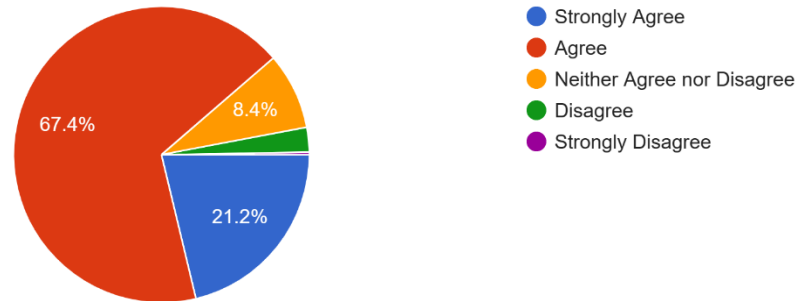

- **Relevance of syllabus:** A very high percentage of students (67.4 %) agreed with the relevance of the syllabus to the modern nature of the subject. Another, 21.2 percentage of students strongly agreed with content of the syllabus. **In other words, a total of 88.6 percent of students have positive opinion about the relevance of the content of the syllabus curriculum** (Full statistics below).

1. The courses/syllabi of the subject taught in the semester are relevant to modern nature of the subject.

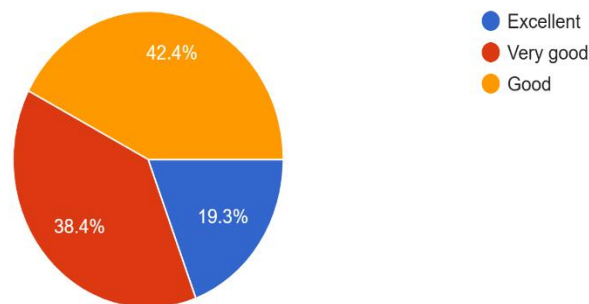

- **Size of the syllabus:** About the size of the syllabus in terms of workload 42.4 percent students responded as “good” (38.4 %) followed by “very good” and “excellent” (19.3 %) in order of rank. (Full statistics below).

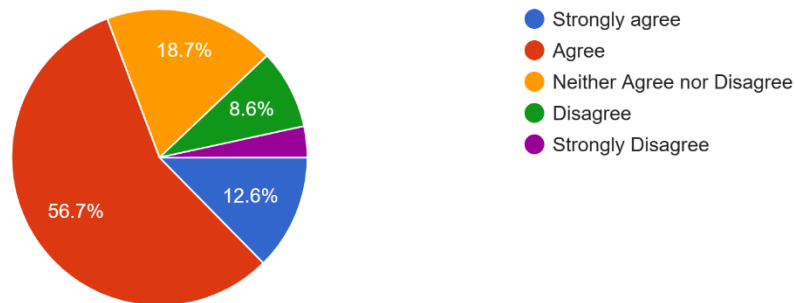
2. Size of the syllabus in terms of the workload on the students

- **Availability of library resources:** A good 69.3 percent (agree – 56.7 % and strongly agree – 12.6 %) responded with positive affirmation. However, 12 percent (disagree – 8.6 % and strongly disagree – 3.4 percent) were not in agreement and another 8.6 percent were neutral on the availability of library resources. **In aggregate 20.6 percent students have reservations about the library and the resources available in them. This needs to be considered with greater attention by the institution.**

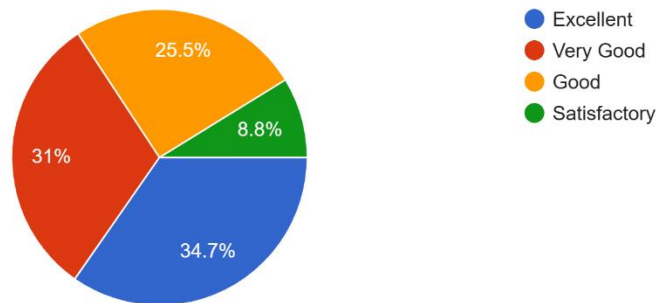
➤ **Transaction in the classroom and beyond**

The transaction in the classroom and beyond is measured on the scale of 1 to 4 with 4 meaning excellent and 1 meaning satisfactory and in between there were very good and good in order of rank.

➤ **Ability to bring conceptual clarity and promotion of thinking ability by teacher:**

The highest percentage (34.7 %) for the response about the ability of the teacher to bring conceptual clarity and promotion of thinking was excellent. Very good (31 %) and good (25.5 %) responses followed. About 8.8 percent responded “satisfactory”. This response is relatively low yet this has to be addressed to enhance comprehensive quality in the transaction of curriculum.

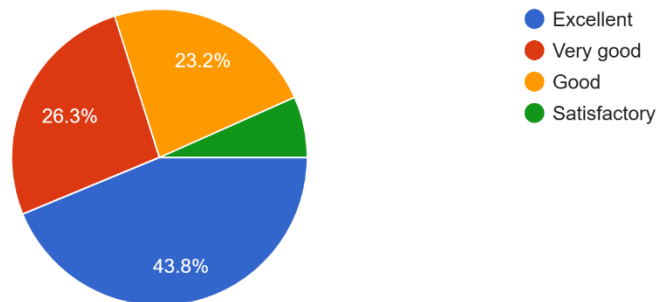
4. Ability to bring conceptual clarity and promotion of thinking ability by teacher -

➤ **Communication skill of the teachers:**

On the communication skills front the highest frequency of response was “excellent” (43.8 %) followed by very good (26.3 %) and good (23.2 %). About 7 percent responded satisfactory.

706 responses

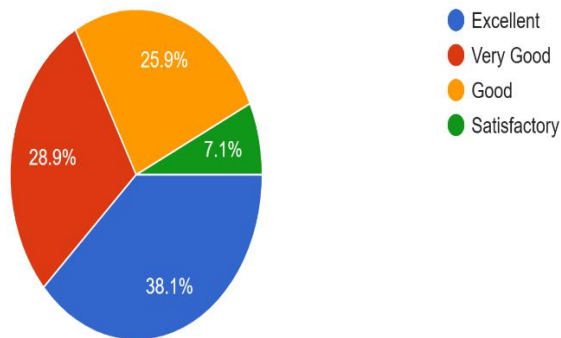


➤ **Regularity and punctuality of the teachers:**

On the regularity and punctuality front the highest frequency of response is 38.1 percent, followed by “very good” and “good” with a percentage of 28.9 and 25.9 percent respectively. About 7 percent responded “satisfactory”. The almost proportionate distribution of varied

responses indicates there is no clear cut unambiguous opinion about the regularity and punctuality of the teachers. So, this aspects of the institution needs attention.

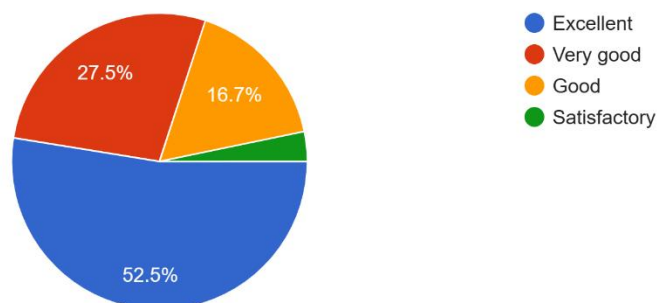
6. Regularity and punctuality of the teachers -

➤ **Subject knowledge of the teacher:**

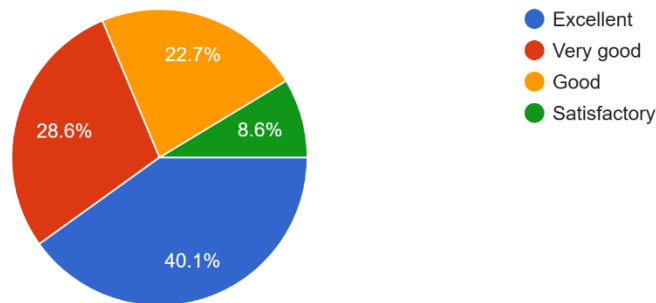
52.5 percent of the respondents' response on the subject knowledge of the teacher is "excellent".

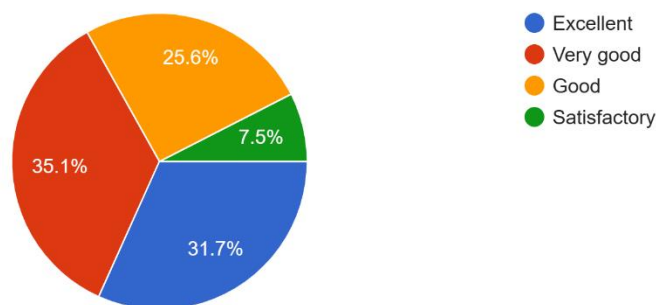


Just like regularity and punctuality of teachers aspect, this aspect viz. motivation and inspiration provided by the teachers also need attention with almost proportionate varied responses.

With almost proportionate distribution of varied responses completion and coverage of course by the teachers also needs to be looked in.

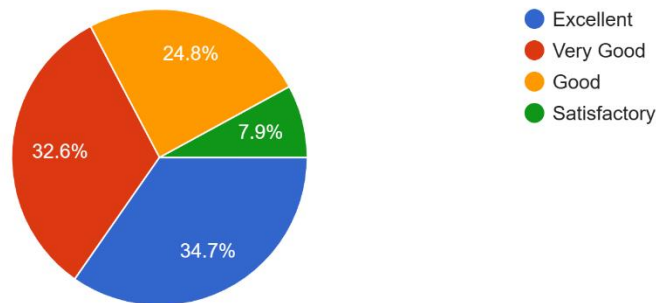
9. Completion and coverage of course by the teachers -

The ability of the teachers to make the subject/learning interesting also needs to be looked in with almost proportionate varied responses.

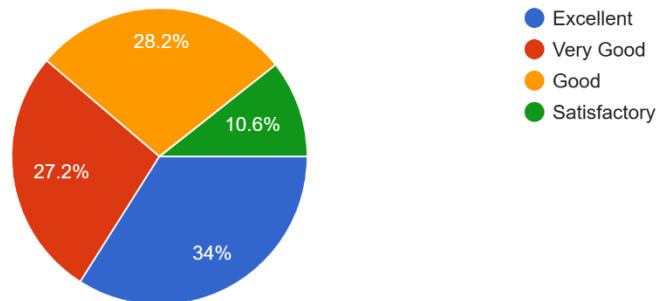
10. Ability of the teachers to make the subject/learning interesting -

706 responses

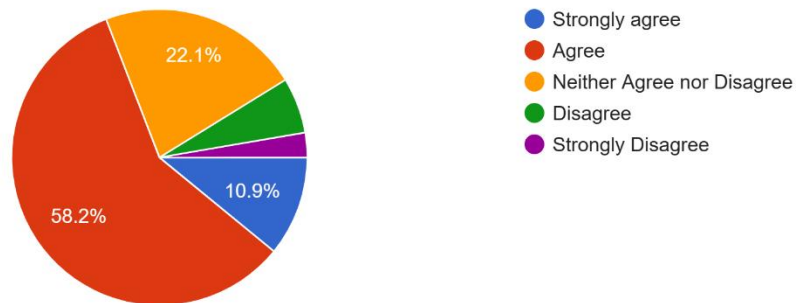


• **Use of technology in learning:**

58.2 percent of respondents agreed with the ICT facilities followed by 22.1 percent neither agree nor disagree (22.1 %), disagree and strongly disagree.

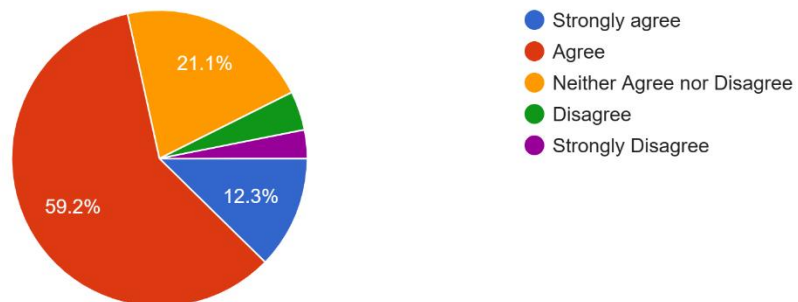
12. ICT facilities in the college are adequate and satisfactory -
